Naxos Summer School is addressed to undergraduate and postgraduate students, PhD candidates, as well as researchers and post-doctoral students. The number of eligible students will be selected under the designated selection process by the Steering Committee. The language of seminars will be Greek.

During the last 14 years the Naxos Summer School has successfully taken place in Paros (2003-2011) and Naxos (2011-2017) islands focusing on the topics of Economic Geography, Regional science and Spatial Economics, which are considered to be among the most important and influential topics of today's scientific theory and research.

Naxos Summer School will focus on Issues of Local Development, as a pillar towards sustainable island development, especially within the today's current international economic crisis framework. The Naxos Summer school will cover topics, such as:
