## **Discussion papers series**

The *Laboratory of Economic Geography, Regional Development and Territorial Planning* of the Department of Geography, University of the Aegean, is proudly announcing the launch of its Discussion Papers Series and would like kindly to invite you to contribute and participate in this Series publication.

The Discussion Papers Series is scheduled to be published three times (open access-on line) a year in Greek or English language, and will include the publication of papers on EU and national research in the following fields:

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## **Guidelines to the author(s)**

1. Papers should not exceed 8,000 words (references not included).
2. The title of the paper, the author(s) name(s), addresses, affiliation, tel/fax and e-mails should appear in the front page only. An abstract of the paper (up to 200 words) and key-words should follow in the next page.
3. The main text of the paper should be written in double space with a well known font (preferably Times New Roman 12). All pages of the paper (with the exception of the title page) should be numbered in continuous numbering.
4. The sections and sub-sections of the paper should have brief titles and follow the decimal numbering system (e.g. 1, 1.1, 2, 2.1, etc).

5. Tables, diagrams and maps should have titles and be numbered in continuous numbering. The source should appear at the bottom left of the table, diagram or map.
6. Citations should follow the Harvard citation system (citation in the text –e.g. Harvey 1982). In case of citing a particular point or an extract of a work, the page(s) should be included (e.g. Harvey 1982: 35).
7. Footnotes should be avoided (or kept at a minimum).
8. The full bibliographical references should appear alphabetically in a list of references at the end of the main text, and should abide by the following pattern:

**Book:**

Harvey D. (1982) *The Limits to Capital*. Oxford: Blackwell.

**Book chapter:**

Graham S. (2002) “Communication grids: Cities and infrastructure”. In Sassen S. (ed.) *Global Networks – Linked Cities*. New York & London: Routledge, pp. 71-91.

**Article in scientific journal:**
